# 2026 Town of Huntertown General Fund Budget Plan

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# Explanation of important expenses, Town of Huntertown, for fiscal year 2024

#### **GENERAL FUND 1101**

Funded first by property taxes; which is largely impacted by SB1. Town has received \$150,359 as of June 30; (283,529 received in 2024). Cigarette (\$4,200), Vehicle Excise (\$20,276); and alcohol (\$21,602) estimates are in. LIT Certified Shared revenue is currently unknown. First six months revenue of 2025 is \$70,308 plus a supplemental distribution in May of \$17,951, for a fiscal total of \$158,567 (estimate was \$140,622). We received \$242,733 in 2024; reduction due to creation of the Northwest Fire District. Bank account interest \$267,291 for first 6 months (doubled to \$534,582) We received 407,893 in 2024. Cable TV Franchise Fees for first 6 months are \$16,930.82 (doubled to 33,860). We received \$39,190 in 2024. Miscellaneous receipts (golf cart permits/mowing invoices/other misc.) total 2,600 through June 30. Rough estimate of \$1,059,360 in total revenue. Budgeted expenses total \$683,000. June 30 cash balance \$1,911,331.04.

- Employee raises ??? General fund includes only Elected officials (50-percent) and Town Manager (20-percent)
- Increase in police protection for 3<sup>rd</sup> Resource Officer from \$250,000 to \$355,000. Contract
  would need approved between Town and Sheriff's Department. Current contract for two
  officers totals \$235,864.35.
- Attorney (NTE \$25,000) and Engineering (NTE \$30,000) services are in the final year of current
   3-year contract. Decision on renewal/NTE amounts needs to be made.
- No other major changes

# MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY FUND (2201)

Estimated Revenue from state is \$192,105.50. Current year 6-month revenue total is \$100,744. (\$191,170 total revenue in 2024). Estimated Surtax and Wheel tax revenue from County is \$200,000 (\$101,920 as of June 30, 2025; \$198,295 actual in 2024). MMA Interest is \$4,087 in 2025 (\$7,765 in 2024). June 30 cash balance is \$1,159,014.38.

Employee raises – ??? MVH covers all outside utility workers up to 20-percent.

Improvements of Streets 401 - \$60,000

- Bridge Withholding \$27,000.
- Remainder for sand/salt and pot hole mix; asphalt for total patcher.

Machinery and Equipment 402 - \$60,000.

- John Deere Gator \$30,000
- John Deere Roller \$15,000

Total budgeted expenses total \$412,500. Total Revenue estimated at \$400,105.00

# MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY RESTRICTED FUND (2203)

Estimated Revenue from state is \$192,105.50. 2024 distribution was \$191,170. Current year first six months of revenue totals \$100,744. June 30 cash balance was approximately \$547,843.95. This fund can ONLY be used for road projects. Plan to budget \$190,000.

- Twin Eagles Blvd. (\$123,000)
- Pheasant Run (\$62,015)

LOCAL ROAD AND STREET FUND (2202)

Estimated Revenue for 2026 is \$214,445. Current year 6-months revenue is \$119,282 (total for 2024 was \$228,910). June 30 cash balance is approximately \$835,447.19. Listed below are \$174,000 worth of expenses. Plan to budget \$200,000.

- Track Loader (\$1,000)/Mini Excavator (\$1,000) trade-in programs
- Vactor Truck (\$24,900 annually through 2027)
- Crack sealing machine rental (\$12,000)
- Engineering for road projects (\$100,000)
- Street striping (\$25,000)
- Tree/limb removal (\$10,000)

#### CEDIT (2209)

Estimated revenue for 2026 is unknown. Revenue for 2025 will total \$2,087.312 (\$1,831,257 for monthly distribution + \$256,055 May supplemental distribution). Revenue in 2024 was \$2,084,532.96. June 30 cash balance is approximately \$6.47 million. Plan to budget \$2.5 million.

- Appollo Drive/Canaveral Court/Hunter's Ridge CCMG (\$1,665,441). CCMG award max is \$1 million and covers 80-percent. Town would be responsible for 20-percent (\$200,000) plus the remainder (\$665,441) for a fiscal total of \$865,441.
- 2025 CCMG funds for Gemini, Mercury and Rabbit Run may need encumbered depending on 2025 project status.
- Carroll Road east additional \$270,000; if not paid in 2025 we can either budget for or encumber from 2025 to cover this cost.
- Lima Access Drive is on the PAMP for 2024. Estimated total is \$430,081 (Share 3-ways with LRS and CCD with each paying 143,360.33).
- Town Hall/Town Buildings landscaping improvements (\$50,000)
- Sidewalks/Trails (\$200,000)
- Economic Development/Downtown Beautification (\$500,000)
- Veteran Memorial (\$200,000)

#### **RIVERBOAT FUND (2235)**

Estimated Revenue is \$52,000. (2025 distribution will be received in fall; 2024 distribution totaled \$52,349.00). Can be used for any legal purpose. June 30 balance is approximately \$203,052. Approximately \$45,000 in expenses listed below. Plan to budget \$50,000.

- Pickup truck to update fleet Estimated at \$80,000 with 3-way split (\$26,667).
- Replace 2015 Equinox quote received for 2023 GMC Acadia at \$50,623. Estimating high at \$55,000 total with 3-way split (\$18,334).

### RAINY DAY FUND (2236)

Non-revenue fund. Plan to budget \$15,000. June 30 balance was approximately \$111,484.11. Any use, typically saved for end-of-year emergency if a fund is running low.

# LOIT PUBLIC SAFETY (2240)

Estimated revenue for 2026 in unknown. Revenue for 2025 will be \$41,949, up from \$26,082 in 2024. June 30 balance is approximately \$120,542. Budget amount is \$10,000.

# ARPA CORONOVIRUS RELIEF FUND (2403)

Total of \$1,546,503.46 needed to be and was allocated by Dec. 31, 2024, and need to be spent by Dec. 31, 2026. Plan to have all expenses paid by the end of 2025. Any remaining balanced unpaid will be encumbered from 2025 to 2026.

#### LEASE RENTAL FUND (3318)

2026 Town Hall payment (\$90,000 principal; \$18,834 interest; last payment July 2032 = 13 installments or 6.5 years). Funded through Excise Tax, CVET tax and Property tax.

# CUMMULATIVE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND (CCI) FUND (4401)

Estimated Revenue for 2026 is \$15,400. June 30 balance is approximately \$95,514.65. Plan to budget \$15,000 with \$14,500 in expenses listed below.

- (1/3) Fort Wayne IT Solutions contract (\$7,200)
- Website Renewal (\$2,500)
- (1/3) Boyce Keystone product renewal (\$5,000). We are looking into a new Keystone product that may increase this cost significantly. If so, this expense may move from CCI to CCD.

# CUMMULATIVE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT (CCD) FUND (4402)

Estimated revenue is tied to property tax distribution (\$286,809.98 thus far in 2025; \$436,199.25 received in 2024). We re-established the rate for 2024 and increased revenue by \$380,921.25 from 2023. Also funded by Excise/CVET distributions (2026 estimate is \$35,474). Estimated Revenue between \$500,000-\$600,000. June 30 balance is approximately \$1,073,277.23. Budget \$500,000. Fund can be used for any legal purpose.

- Hunters Ridge Lane is on 2026 PAMP for an estimated cost of \$300,472.00.
- Extra for bridges/streets/sidewalks/downtown beautification
- Emergency purchase

# **REDEVLOPMENT COMMISSION FUND (4445)**

New statute requires a spending plan approved by RDC and Town Council.

REMINDER — Virtual Budget Workshop is scheduled for Monday, August 11, 2025, at 10 a.m. Public Hearing will take place at the September 2, 2025, meeting. Adoption of the ordinance will take place at the September 15, 2024, meeting. I have five (5) days after passage to submit all documents to the DLGF. Deadline for passing the budget is Nov. 3, 2025 and the deadline for submitting a budget to the DLGF is Nov. 10, 2025.

# Meeting of the Town Council of Huntertown, Indiana Monday, August 18, 2025, 6:00 p.m. Huntertown Town Hall, 15617 Lima Road

A public meeting of the Huntertown Town Council was held on Monday, August 4, 2025, at Huntertown Town Hall, 15617 Lima Road, Huntertown, IN. Present were town council members Michael Aker, Patricia Freck; Brad Hite (P); and Brandon Seifert; Town Manager Hannah Walker; Clerk-Treasurer Ryan Schwab; Resource Officer Brandon Reichert; Steven Cardenas, Jessica Hile and Derek Frederickson of Engineering Resources Inc.; Mike Hawk of Hawk Haynie Kammeyer & Smith; Patrick Rew of the Allen County Department of Planning Services; five (5) members of the public and zero (0) members of the media. Absent was council member Tina McDonald. The meeting was livestreamed on the Town's YouTube Channel.

Brad Hite called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **COUNCIL ACTION**

Patricia Freck made a motion to approve the minutes of August 4, 2025, regular meeting. Brandon Seifert seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Michael Aker made a motion to approve the minute of August 18, 2025, Executive Session, noting that Darren Vogt needed to be added to those who attended. Patricia Freck seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Brandon Seifert made a motion to approve the general, water, and sewer claims dated August 18, 2025, in the amount of \$1,346,879.94. Patricia Freck seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Patricia Freck made a motion to secure payment from Northwest Allen County Schools for utility connection fees based on the town's current ordinance. Michael Aker seconded. Hannah Walker provided the council with an overview of the issue, noting that the school district should have paid its connection fees in 2024 under a different ordinance for a different amount. However, the pre-construction meeting in which fees are collected did not occur as there was no Town Manager hired at the time. The district is requesting to pay what it should have under the prior ordinance instead of what the current ordinance states. Utility Service Board President Tony Ramey and Town Council member Brandon Seifert each spoke on the issue, agreeing that the school should have to pay under the current ordinance. After no further discussion, the motion carried 4-0.

Brandon Seifert made a motion to introduce Huntertown Ordinance 2025-011, an Ordinance amending the town's floodplain ordinance. Patricia Freck seconded. Patrick Rew provided an overview of the ordinance, which repeals the flood plain language from the ordinance. A second ordinance will be presented to council to add in the new language. After no further discussion, the motion carried 4-0.

Michael Aker made a motion to consider Huntertown Ordinance 2025-011, an Ordinance amending the town's floodplain ordinance. Patricia Freck seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Michael Aker made a motion to approve Change Order No. 10 for the Carroll Road Reconstruction project in the amount of \$175,749.38. Patricia Freck seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Brandon Seifert made a motion to approve a professional engineering services agreement with Engineering Resources Inc in the amount of \$92,400.00 for the Apollo Drive street improvement project. Patricia Freck seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Brandon Seifert made a motion to introduce Huntertown Ordinance 2025-009, an Ordinance to amend Chapter 154 of the Town of Huntertown Ordinance. Michael Aker seconded. Patrick Rew provided the council with an overview of the ordinance and provided some alternatives to some past issues council members had related to Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) and container homes. Rew suggested that the council consider limiting ADU's to lots sized larger than 18,000 square feet and any requests to put an ADU on a lot smaller than 18,000 square feet would require a special use permit. He suggested leaving the language as is for container homes since all container home requests would require a special user permit. After no further discussion, Brandon Seifert made a motion to amend his motion, adding the language that ADUs would only be permitted for lots larger than 18,000 square feet and all other requests would need to get a special use permit. Michael Aker seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

Michael Aker made a motion to consider Huntertown Ordinance 2025-009, an Ordinance to amend Chapter 154 of the Town of Huntertown Ordinance, as amended. Patricia Freck seconded. Patrick Rew advised the council not to continue to adopt the ordinance at this meeting and to allow the changes to happen at the county level. Once the changes are official at the county level, the ordinance will be brought back for adoption. After no further discussion, the motion carried 4-0.

Outside of items listed under Council Action, no other New Business was brought forth.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Outside of items listed under Council action, no other Old Business was brought forth.

### REPORTS

Resource Officer Brandon Reichert had the following report:

• He provided the council with an update on the process for getting a third resource officer. The Department currently has four new officers training at the academy. The job will be posted once academy training is complete. A hire is now more likely for the end of the year.

Clerk-Treasurer Ryan Schwab had the following report:

• The 2026 budget workshop was completed on August 11, 2025. He has until Saturday, August 23, 2025, to make any changes. Form 3 (Notice to Advertise Public Hearing) muse be posted on Gateway by that date. Michael Aker asked about including a budget for the Huntertown Family Park if and when it is deeded for the town. Schwab said he would work with the town attorney to go over the process, but nothing for a park is budgeted for 2026.

Town Manager Hannah Walker had the following report:

- She provided an update on why the road closure at Old Lima Road was extended.
- She provided an update on the compost site at the town's street department building. The site is currently in compliance with the MS4 requirements, and the town is getting feedback from IDEM to get the site properly permitted with them.

Derek Frederickson of Engineering Resources had the following report:

• He noted that the water committee met on August 12, 2025. A full report on that meeting will be given to council at its September 2, 2025, meeting.

Mike Hawk of Hawk Haynie Kammeyer & Smith had no further report.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT

Residents Megan Rogers and Ryan Miller of 1535 Fairway Court thanked Hannah Walker and
the council for looking into the compost site concerns they brought to a prior meeting. Rogers
asked about a timeline and expressed her desire to be informed. Walker said they are waiting for
guidelines from IDEM, but she would be happy to provide her updates.

After no further public comment was brought forth, Patricia Freck made a motion to adjourn. Brandon Seifert seconded. The motion passed with a voice vote and the meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.
